

We went to visit an old tower. It was a fun venue as the garden was big and full of many statues.



We thought we would play a game of knights. We used sticks to have a duel. Kit pursued me through the statues with his stick.




The duel continued until a bluebird darted out from behind a statue. In shock, I fell back onto the statue. Crash!

We felt bad, so we told them all about the duel and the bluebird. Dad said that he could help us with some of his strong glue.


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We rescued the statue and stuck it down with some strong glue.
