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Where Is the Bird?



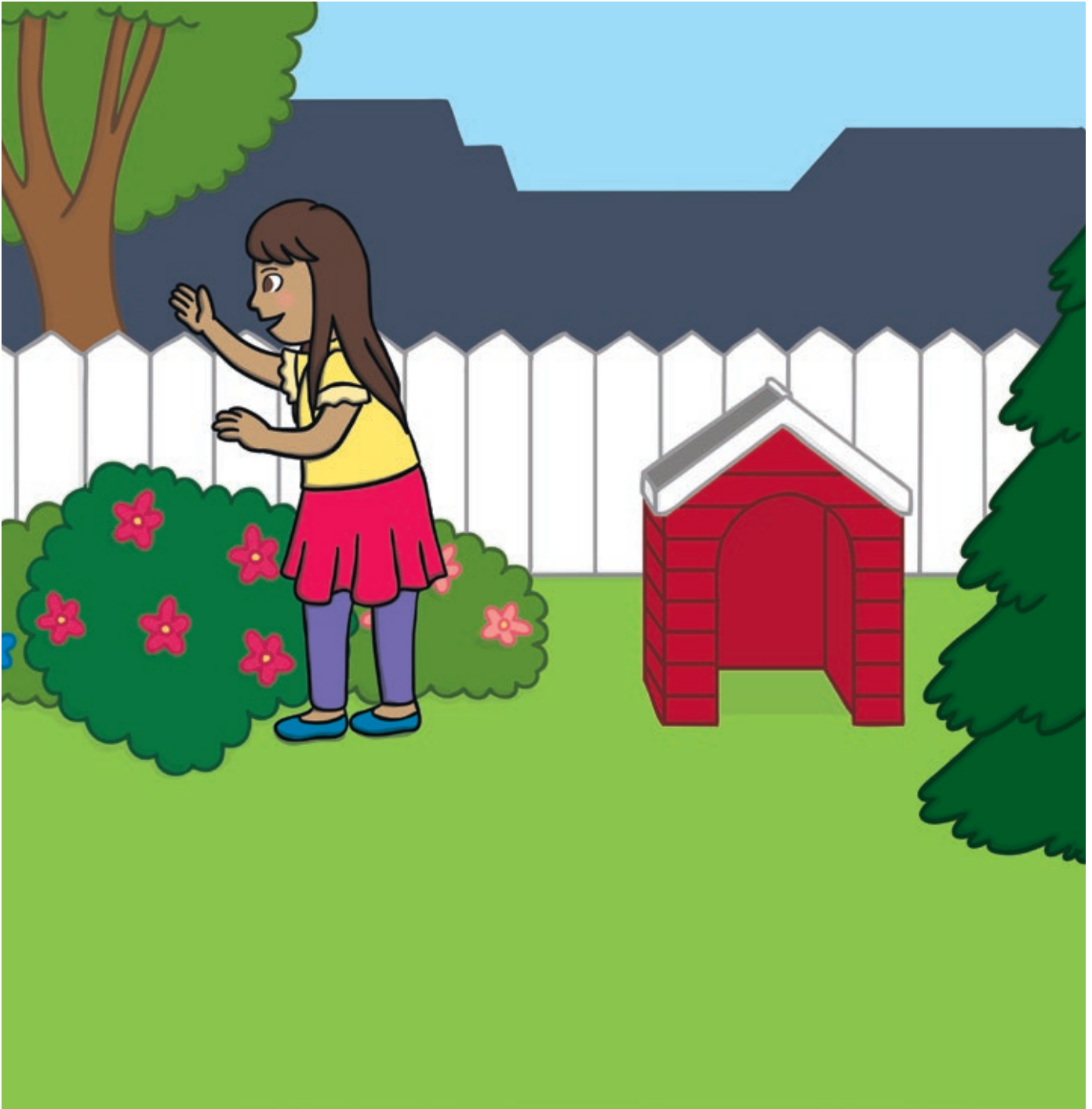
A 'Let's Read Together!' Book
