A message from Miss Whittingham: Happy New Year! The snow and ice along with the return of 'The Byley Flood' has meant it has been a somewhat interesting start to the new term. The children have returned to school with enthusiasm and have also managed the disruption brilliantly. I would like to say a huge thank you to my amazing staff too. They have been amazing – as always!

Exciting Event: we were so lucky to have the Barclays Women's Super League Trophy come in to school on Tuesday. One of our parents - Mr Burgess - had very kindly secured this for us. The trophy is an iconic symbol of excellence in women's football; it highlights how the importance of ambition, hard work and belief in yourself to be the best you can be. We felt very honoured to have such a prestigious trophy in our school. The Trophy was on display in the school hall. The children were told what it was made of - 24 carat black gold! They were also told who the current champions are - Chelsea - as well as who can actually touch it - none of us were allowed.

All the children were photographed with the trophy either on their own or with their siblings which you should have received by email.

I held a follow up assembly on Wednesday. I read the story 'Incredible You'. We talked about having and following dreams, working/practising hard as well as the importance of resilience and perseverance. An important message for the start of the new year.

Reading: please continue to encourage your child to read at home. Every Monday morning, children's reading diaries are taken in. If a child has read 3 or 4 times in the week, they get 1 spot on their chart. If they have read 5 times or more, they get 2 spots. Once they reach 20 spots, they will receive a certificate in our Friday Celebration Assembly. Reading regularly - or being read to - very much supports children with developing their understanding, confidence, reading fluency and writing
